Early College - 9th, 10th, 11th, and non-graduating 12th graders: Update as of 4.3.2020

Freshman, Sophomores, Juniors, and non-graduating Seniors in May 2020

High School Diploma Graduation Requirements have not changed. MCC Associate degree requirements have not changed.

Grading

All high school classes, including VISS and NCVPS, and all MCC college courses are continuing in an online format, and grades will be taken and placed on the high school and college transcripts at the end of the Spring 2020 semester.

- In high school classes, there will be no exam grade counting 20%. No EOCs and no NCFEs will be administered. Teachers may administer exams that will calculate in the 4th nine weeks' average.
- In high school classes, the student's 3rd Nine Weeks grade and 4th Nine Weeks grade will be averaged to calculate the Semester Final Grade.
- Final grades in high school and college classes for the Fall and Spring semesters will count in the student's high school GPA, transcript and class rank. As always, college grades will count on the student's college GPA and transcript.
- The withdrawal process from college courses has not changed. MCC is proceeding with online courses and taking grades.
